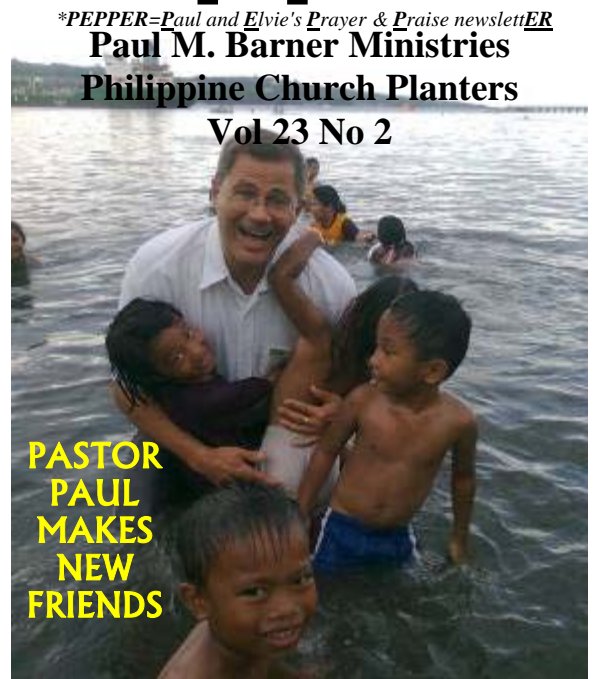
THREE IRONMAN TRIATHLONS IN 2011!

**OUR STREET KIDS HOME
GETS A RESIDENT**

Dear Dean [the man who bought the street-kids house for us to use],

I'm very happy to announce that our new house parents have proven very resourceful. Ronnie has found his own volunteer social worker, befriended the government agent in charge of child welfare, and has taken in his first street-kid. He also has leads on five more children (including a set of three brothers) which he will follow up on after an initial introduction period with the first child.

The boy is 11 years old and his name is Raymond (not sure on the spelling, they're creative with spellings here). He was living at the bus terminal where he was abandoned by his parents. They apparently told him they were going to Manila, but God only knows if that was even the truth. He hasn't heard from them since.

He has since made a living at the terminal by sweeping out buses at a rate of 10 pesos (about 25 cents US) per bus.

Raymond was recently the unfortunate witness to the death of one of his friends, who was hit and killed by one of the buses. That means he's also going to be the main witness in the resulting trial.

I'll try to flesh out some more details on his background soon, but when I arrived at the house he was enjoying a hot cooked meal and being interviewed by Lani, his new house-mom.

I didn't want to be too much of an interruption -- they seem like they're really on top of things.

FAQ: (Frequently Asked Question):

Q: What is a "Balik-bayan Box?"

A: Balik-bayan Boxes are large (3ftx2.5ftx2.5ft) cardboard boxes that are shipped door-to-door from the USA to the Philippines by size, not weight. They are much cheaper than the post office. Typically they go for \$90-\$120 per box, any weight.
