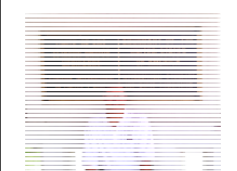

FAQ: (Frequently Asked Question):
Q: Do you “kidnap” kids from the streets?

A: No. We pass each child through police and social welfare analysis.

Since the car’s insurance carrier restricts driving to TX, NM, LA, MO & AR, I parked temporarily in a pay-lot for a few hours and stepped-foot over the Rio Grande River into Mexico, for the first time in my life! Although the people seemed poor, their lifestyles were a little better than those we serve in the Philippines. Yet all people need Jesus.

THE “RECAPTURING” OF ONE OF OUR STREET BOYS

“Praise the Lord! He has answered our prayers!”

At 4:30, Ben (our Boy’s Home administrator) teamed up with Elvie, me and Roger (the BCA guard), plus one of my assistant pastors, Carlo. We caught Cezar, (one of our runaways), sleeping. It was amazing to actually find him.

Cezar refused to come until we removed him from his hiding-place. We stopped at Barner Christian Academy to talk and reason with the boy. Cezar's cousin and his younger brother Alan accompanied him to make him more comfortable.

At the school, we talked a little about Cezar's problems, and a lot more about potential solutions. Despite his running away and failure to complete school this year (the school year ended in March) we've found a solution that may allow him to advance to 6th grade next year.

Starting in April, Cezar came to the school to take accelerated review classes to culminate in placement testing on April 28. Results are not yet all in, but If he did well, he may move up on schedule. If he does REALLY well (he is a smart boy) he might actually skip a grade or two.

We had to work together. The Barner family agreed to host him through the weekend. Cezar’s 6-year-old little brother accompanied him to our boy's ranch on Samal Island the next Sunday afternoon. Cezar came peacefully (after another brief running away), and Alan (his brother) was eager to go! At the end of April, Cezar will either return to the boys' ranch or be reconciled with his mother. In either case, he'll be back to school in June, which is a desperate necessity for his future.
